
Everything introduced and discussed in Foundations are a mixture of Scripture along with ideas and explanations from multiple different people and sources.

There are a lot of studies, books, seminars, conferences, etc. out there teaching on the things of God. He is endless and limitless. Ultimately, this entire life we experience ought to be lived out of the overflow of our daily encounters with the One whom created us. At least, that is what many of us believe.



What we read about God in the Scriptures and the other being our perception or experience of those things.

To know God is to *experience* God. The Bible has a word for it and that word is **GENESKO**.

It means "to know by first-hand experience."


Take a Risk:

Each time you step out in faith, it's a risk.


Ask God to meet you in showing that characteristic to someone else.

WEEK 2 DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

• Based on your reading of Genesis 1-3, what did God say about the things He created? If God were sitting with you at this table, what do you think He would say to you?

 God set all of this up for us to be in right relationship with four main spheres of living: God, others, myself, and my purpose. In our broken relationship with God, it is easier to think lesser of ourselves and project that onto God. In fact, our understanding of God's being is experienced through what we think He thinks about us. Whatever we messed up in our lives, God wants to fix and make whole. God doesn't look at us and feel disappointed, He looks at us and sees children wanting to be held, wanting to be healed. What one area in your life do you sense God wants to fix so that you can fully be in the right relationship with Him?

VIDEO DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

 Last week we talked about the Identity of God through the lens of Information and Experience. This week we are discussing the Activity of God through the lens of Being and Doing. Who God is can be known by what God does. What are some things the video pointed out that God has done or is doing?

• What is one thing from the video that stood out to you, and why?

SCRIPTURES IN THE TALK:

He pursues us by speaking to us by His Creation, The Bible, and His Spirit whether directly to us or through others. Let's look at some Bible verses expressing this:

Last week the risk was to be intentional in living out one of the characteristics of God toward someone. This week, be intentional and go out of your way to serve someone.


It could be buying someone else's meal when out to eat. Or their coffee in the drive thru line.

It could be leaving a \$20-\$100 tip for a server on a disproportionately smaller tab.

You could write 'Thank You' cards to the team of people you immediately work with, thanking them for what you appreciate about them as a person.

You could offer to babysit your friends' children for free so they could have a night out.

These are just ideas, so pray and think through something you could go out of your way to do for someone else. Journal what you experience and what you sense from God in the midst of it.

WEEK 3 DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

• Before listening to today's explanation about sin, what were some words and pictures you had whenever you heard that word?

 Part of the saving process of believing in Jesus is to think differently about areas of our life that do not align with what God would want for us. Take some time to identify and write down some areas of your life that you need to bring to God. If you want to share with the group and pray about it, feel free to do so.

 If you believe in Jesus and what He accomplished, when did you first believe? What is one area of your life where you want to trust Jesus to heal and deliver you? This can be done silently in your journal or shared and prayed about with the group. "Then Jesus came near and said to them, 'All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe everything I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

³ For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. 4 For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, ⁵ so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another.⁶ Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them: if prophecy, in proportion to our faith; 7 if service, in our serving; the one who teaches, in his teaching; ⁸ the one who exhorts. in his exhortation: the one who contributes, in generosity; the one who leads, with zeal; the one who does acts of mercy, with cheerfulness.

Marks of the True Christian

⁹ Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is good. ¹⁰ Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor. ¹¹ Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord. ¹² Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer. ¹³ Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality.

¹⁴ Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. ¹⁵ Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep.¹⁶ Live in harmony with one another. Do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly. Never be wise in your own sight.¹⁷ Repay no one evil for evil, but give thought to do what is honorable in the sight of all. ¹⁸ If possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all.¹⁹ Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord."²⁰ To the contrary, "if your enemy is hungry, feed him; if he is thirsty, give him something to drink; for by so doing you will heap burning coals on his head."²¹ Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

Get into the Scriptures: John 1-6



Take a Risk:

Each time you step out in faith, it's a risk.

Ask God to meet you this week in a way you may not have experienced Him before. Pray with God about what He sees when He looks at you. What He sees is the wholeness of who you are in Him. Those thoughts may be different than the negative things you think about yourself.

Journal what you sense God telling you about you. Sift through the negative, self-condemning, or disqualifying thoughts that come to mind. Write those down and give them to God.

Pay attention to the word pictures you get in your mind. Things like, "You are my beloved son/daughter."


"I love you." "You are my child."

"I enjoy your sense of humor."

"You are a giver."

"I appreciate how you handled that situation the other day..."

Things like this are God encouraging your soul.





Everything said about Jesus in the book of John is a blueprint for how we should view the work of Christ in us and the work we do in His name.

You were supposed to read the first six chapters of John, and this week's after meeting reading will be the remainder of John's Gospel. This is on purpose for what we are about to hear in this first video describing all the things said about Jesus in the first 12 chapters of John's Gospel.

VIDEO DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

 Of the descriptive words and "I am..." statements, which one most resonated with you based on your experience with thinking about and praying to Jesus?

• Based on your reading of John 1-6 or something in the video, talk about something that stood out to you and why?

 One of the keys to growing in understanding is developing good questions in response to things you are being taught. What are some questions you have from the reading or the video? "Christ's Example of Humility

¹ If then there is any encouragement in Christ, if any consolation of love, if any fellowship with the Spirit, if any affection and mercy, ² fulfill my joy by thinking the same way, having the same love, sharing the same feelings, focusing on one goal. ³ Do nothing out of rivalry or conceit, but in humility consider others as more important than yourselves. ⁴ Everyone should look out not only for his own interests, but also for the interests of others.

Christ's Humility and Exaltation ⁵ Make your own attitude that of Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, existing in the form of God, did not consider equality with God as something to be used for His own advantage. 7 Instead He emptied Himself by assuming the form of a slave, taking on the likeness of men. And when He had come as a man in His external form. He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death even to death on a cross. ⁸ For this reason God highly exalted Him and gave Him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus

every knee will bow of those who are in heaven and on earth and under the earth— ¹¹ and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

¹² So then, my dear friends, just as you have always obeyed, not only in my presence, but now even more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling. ¹³ For it is God who is working in you, enabling you both to desire and to work out His good purpose. ¹⁴ Do everything without grumbling and arguing, ¹⁵ so that you may be blameless and pure, children of God who are faultless in a crooked and perverted generation, among whom you shine like stars in the world. ¹⁶ Hold firmly to the message of life."

We cannot talk about the Body of Christ without talking about the Purpose of the Church and vice versa. They're inextricably linked and understood in relation with each other. Although, this week we will focus on what it means to be a part of the Body of Christ.

We will also explain what it means to be unified with Jesus and in recognizing this ONEness, we are like Jesus both here on earth and in Heaven.

This ONEness is not singular in the sense that I am more like Jesus than you or anyone else and we are supposed to be a bunch of little Jesus' running around.

Our ONEness with Jesus is in the unified expression of those whom believe the words, work, and ministry of Jesus.

That is what love is: the dying to and emptying of self for the sake of another.

"One Body with Many Parts

¹² The human body has many parts, but the many parts make up one whole body. So it is with the body of Christ. ¹³Some of us are Jews, some are Gentiles, Greek some are Greeks. some are slaves, and some are free. But we have all been baptized into one body by one Spirit, and we all share the same Spirit. Greek we were all given one Spirit to drink.

¹⁴Yes, the body has many different parts, not just one part. ¹⁵If the foot says, "I am not a part of the body because I am not a hand," that does not make it any less a part of the body. ¹⁶And if the ear says, "I am not part of the body because I am not an eye," would that make it any less a part of the body? ¹⁷If the whole body were an eye, how would you hear? Or if your whole body were an ear, how would you smell anything?

¹⁸But our bodies have many parts, and God has put each part just where he wants it. ¹⁹How strange a body would be if it had only one part! ²⁰Yes, there are many parts, but only one body. ²¹The eye can never say to the hand, "I don't need you." The head can't say to the feet, "I don't need you."

²²In fact, some parts of the body that seem weakest and least important are actually the most necessary. ²³And the parts we regard as less honorable are those we clothe with the greatest care. So we carefully protect those parts that should not be seen, ²⁴while the more honorable parts do not require this special care. So God has put the body together such that extra honor and care are given to those parts that have less dignity. ²⁵This makes for harmony among the members, so that all the members care for each other. ²⁶If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it, and if one part is honored, all the parts are glad.

²⁷All of you together are Christ's body, and each of you is a part of it."

1 CORINTHIANS 12:12-27



WEEK 5 DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

 In the family of God, we are all equal. Based on your life experiences, have you always felt this way? If not, share with the group your feelings of inequity when compared to others.

 By ourselves, we cannot be a full picture of the embodiment of Jesus, this is a together thing. It takes all of us to make up the Body of Jesus, His words, work, and ministry. Consider the skills and experiences you enjoy, now consider them through the lens of what they mean to be connected with other people. What do you do well, or what really interests you, that you bring as one part of the body to bless the whole?

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

• Read 1 Corinthians 12:13-14. Share why it is important for us to understand our identity within the church.

 Read John 17:22-23. Share what stands out from this John passage. What thoughts or feelings does Jesus' prayer stir in your heart?

 Pastor and Theologian Tim Keller said this about "unity" as a key characteristic that should describe the church. In summarizing John 17: "...one of the most crucial ways that the Christian church embodies the gospel is in the unity of Christians who are different from one another—economically, culturally, racially. In general, the job of the church is to show the world that people who cannot live in love and unity outside of Christ can do so in Christ." Describe a way you can contribute to a unity that reflects Jesus' heart for the church. One of the key characteristics about being in the Body is transparency, vulnerability, and honesty. It is hard to be in right relationship with each other if we do not feel we are safe with each other. Read the following quote, listen for key phrases. words, or sentences that stand out to you. "By becoming a Christian, I belong to God and I belong to my brothers and sisters. It is not that I belong to God and then make a decision to join a local church. My being in Christ means being in Christ with those others who are in Christ. This is my identity. This is our identity. If the church is the body of Christ, then we should not live as disembodied Christians."

• Talk to God about your identity as part of the church. Thank Him for the family placed around you in your faith journey.


